UNESCO congratulates Battambang for Joining the UNESCO Creative Cities Network

On 31 October 2023, Battambang becomes the first-ever Cambodian city to join the UNESCO Creative Cities Network. Its designation as a creative city of gastronomy, is a testimony to Battambang's longstanding efforts and commitment to harnessing culture and creativity for sustainable urban development.

On World Cities Day, 55 cities join the UNESCO Creative Cities Network (UCCN), following their designation by UNESCO Director-General Audrey Azoulay. New cities, including Battambang of Cambodia, were acknowledged for their strong commitment to harnessing culture and creativity as part of their development strategies, and displaying innovative practices in human-centred urban planning. With the latest additions, the Network now counts 350 cities in more than one hundred countries, representing seven creative fields: Crafts and Folk Art, Design, Film, Gastronomy, Literature, Media Arts and Music.

The inclusion of Battambang as a UNESCO Creative City in the Gastronomy

category not only showcases its exceptional cuisine but also leverages gastronomy to enhance local development and global cultural exchange.
